
GCBC, 29th November 2020 -Digging Deeper for Children Read the Bible verses, and then draw or write your answers to the questions in the boxes

Isaiah 2:3-4 - "People from many nations will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of Jacob's God. There he will teach us his ways, and we will walk in his paths." For the LORD's teaching will go out from Zion; his word will go out from Jerusalem. The LORD will mediate between nations and will settle international disputes. They will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will no longer fight against nation, nor train for war anymore."

These verses talk about walking in God's ways and living at peace with other people. Because of sin, we don't see this today in our world, but we can look forward to a day when these verses will be true. Where does the Bible tell us we will see perfect life like this?

Romans 8:23-25 - "And we believers also groan, even though we have the Holy Spirit within us as a foretaste of future glory, for we long for our bodies to be released from sin and suffering. We, too, wait with eager hope for the day when God will give us our full rights as his adopted children, including the new bodies he has promised us. We were given this hope when we were saved. (If we already have something, we don't need to hope for it. But if we look forward to something we don't yet have, we must wait patiently and confidently.)"

What do these verses say believers long for (look forward to) and wait for? What do these verses say about hope?
